Feedback from Equality Hub Network Board (Item 3)

- The Equality Hub Network (EHN) Board hasn't met due to the recruitment of a new independent Chair for the EHN Board.
- Lee Adams has been appointed as the Chair of the EHN Board.
- The next EHN Board meeting is Wednesday 20 September, 6pm to 7:30pm.

Personal Independence Payments (PIP) (Item 4)

- The 'Personal Independence Payment and the reassessment of Disability Living Allowance claimants' report by Citizens Advice Sheffield appraises the introduction of PIP for people already receiving DLA. - It was put to the Disability Hub that elected representatives write to Sheffield City Council
 chiefs asking to set up local support in terms of advice to take people though the PIP
 process (Action).



Priority issues and planning for the Disability Hub (Item 6)

- The session was introduced as a chance to conduct debate and voting on setting priority issues for the Disability Hub's annual plan, building on the work the group already started by Diane Owens on behalf of the EHN. Draft templates were available to participants.
- Participants were invited to take part in breakout groups to present 3 main areas and
 preferences for the issues they felt the Disability Hub considered most important in relation
 to accessible and equitable services for disabled people in Sheffield. Participants were
 separated into 4 groups. People were asked to express topics, words and actions they felt
 the Disability Hub should try and have most impact with over the duration of 1 year (see
 separate document 'Breakout Groups Feedback Disability Hub 28 Jun 2017').
- Participants used 2 votes on the topics put forward by all 4 groups. The exercise would be relayed to the wider Disability Hub membership who would be invited to take part by completing a survey based on the results collected, but also inviting them to submit additional ideas to be considered for action (Action).

Disability Hub Members presentations and voting on priority issues (Item 7)

- Everyone was reminded of the limited resources of the Hub and ultimately some may be disappointed their own particular issue may not be taken forward as a priority area.
 - a. Access and Accessible housing scored 8 votes.
 - **b.** Advocacy scored 3 votes at one table. Noted by one table that advocacy runs through all areas and priorities.
 - **c.** Education collected 3 votes.
 - **d. Employment** received 9 votes and all 4 tables talked about employment and received at least one vote each.
 - **e. Social care** and **Stopping isolation** collected 7 votes. All tables mentioned health and social care whilst two talked about living independently and living in dignity.
 - f. Transport collected 7 votes but only one table discussed the issue of transport.
 - g. Joined together services, including advice and advocacy received 3 votes. Health collected 1 vote only and one table talked about health and social care and one table talked about working with others ie with other Hubs and Healthwatch Sheffield (Action).



Updates (Item 8)

Independent advocacy (Item 8a)

- The Advocacy Hub has been set up.
- The Disability Hub's Advocacy Action Group can influence the Advocacy Hub in how it:
 - o provides advocacy
 - o promotes independent advocacy
- The Advocacy Action Group supports the notion of peer advocacy.

Transport Action Group (Item 8b)

- Action Group on taxi services is arranged for July (Action).
- Sheffield City Council is working on a new Transport Strategy to meet the needs of the city.
 - o They hope to make this public at a Cabinet meeting in the autumn.
 - o There will be a consultation on the vision and principles they have identified.
 - They are keen to engage with people with protected characteristics through the Disability Hub to ensure the Strategy is inclusive.
- In view of this it is proposed to adopt the name of 'Transport Action Group' rather than 'Taxi Action Group'.
- Disability Sheffield and Hub Reps had already met with the Council's Licensing service but still await a response to their queries.

Employment - DRILL (Item 8c)

- Disability Sheffield recruited 4 disabled people as researchers who will be working with SOHAS (Sheffield Occupational Health Advisory Service) to find out why employers are not employing people with disabilities.
- This project is being funded by the <u>DRILL programme</u> (Disability Research on Independent Living and Learning).

Leisure and Sport – Special Olympics (Item 8d)

To coincide with the Special Olympics, Disability Sheffield are planning a photographic exhibition in the Winter Gardens during August.

Next Steps

- The results of the prioritising exercise will be relayed to the wider Disability Hub membership who will be invited to take part by completing a survey based on the results collected.
- They will also be invited to submit additional ideas to be considered for action (see Action in Item 6 above).
- The Organising Group will then use the results of the survey together with the prioritising exercise to produce the final Disability Hub Action Plan for 2017/18 (Action).

Information sharing (Item 10)

- The Cross Hub Health Working Group have organised a Health event for the following day, Thursday 29 June 2017, 10am to 5pm at the Town Hall, reminding us that health continues to be a priority for most Hubs. 




Question 3 – Did you feel able to participate?


Question 4 – How would you rate information about what is happening in your local area?
