### **Supporting women in film – Showroom Cinema**

Starting in June the Showroom is becoming an F-Rated cinema, addressing inequality in the film industry by highlighting films in our programme that are created by or starring women. Diversity statistics across the industry are extremely poor: 13.6% of all films made in the UK over the past 10 years have had a female screenwriter attached, and only 11% employed a female director. Despite recent publicity suggesting equality in cinema is on the rise, statistics show very little growth or improvement, both in the UK & oversees. The F-Rating is a response to this, designed to support and promote women in film, both on and off-screen. A film can be marked 'F-Rated' if it is:

- Directed by a woman
- Written by a woman
- Features 'significant a female character on screen in her own right'

If a film meets all 3 criteria, it will receive a 'Triple F-Rating'.

We are launching our F-Rating initiative alongside the first Triple-F-Rated film we're showing, the BFI's stunning re-release of 'Daughters of the Dust' – a landmark in film history and the first film directed by a Black woman ever to receive theatrical release in the US. A ground-breaking feature with dreamlike aesthetics that were the main inspiration for much of Beyoncé's 'Lemonade'. It draws attention to some serious concerns, including about the impact of this change on some older people, the difficulties people with mental health problems and deaf people have with this transition, the quality of DWP decision making and the overall consequences of reduced or nil awards. We make a number of recommendations for changes that would, we believe, go some way towards mitigating these consequences.
