Lee Adams has been appointed as the independent Chair of the Equality Hub Network Board. Lee began her career as a teacher in London. Should Sheffield introduce new byelaws for "No Vehicle Idling"? – Sheffield City Council

Closes Thursday 31 August 2017

New guidance from health experts at the National Institute of Health and Care Excellence (NICE) suggests that those who are very sensitive to harm from air pollution should be protected from the effects of air pollution. This consultation asks your views on whether Sheffield City Council should introduce and enforce new byelaws as suggested by NICE for "no vehicle idling" outside Sheffield schools, hospitals, care homes and other locations within Sheffield. This consultation also asks whether educational or enforcement approaches (fines) should be used. New telephone hotline empowers public to help rough sleepers

A new telephone hotline and text messaging service is being launched to help people sleeping rough in Sheffield off the streets. Members of the public are being asked to use the new freephone number to report the location of people they see sleeping rough to a new street outreach service provided by homelessness charity Framework. Framework, who have been commissioned by Sheffield City Council (SCC) to provide an outreach service to homeless people in Sheffield, are seeking a community-based response to rough sleeping and want as many people as possible to feel empowered to help.

From 1 June, people can:

- Text SOTS to 80800 (followed by a message)
- make a report via www.streetlink.org.uk

Building on previous expertise and experience, team members will carry out regular patrols in the early hours of the morning. They will work intensively with homeless people to get them the support they need. Framework will also be working in close partnership with SCC Housing Options and Advice team, the Cathedral Archer Project and other organisations that support homeless people in the city. Supporting Women in film - Showroom Cinema

Starting in June the Showroom is becoming an F-Rated cinema, addressing inequality in the film industry by highlighting films in our programme that are created by or starring women. Diversity statistics across the industry are extremely poor: 13.6% of all films made in the UK over the past 10 years have had a female screenwriter attached, and only 11% employed a female director. Despite recent publicity suggesting equality in cinema is on the rise, statistics show very little growth or improvement, both in the UK & oversees. The F-Rating is a response to this, designed to support and promote women in film, both on and off-screen. A film can be marked 'F-Rated' if it is:

- Directed by a woman
- Written by a woman
- Features 'significant a female character on screen in her own right'

If a film meets all 3 criteria, it will receive a 'Triple F-Rating'.

We launched our F-Rating initiative alongside the first Triple-F-Rated film we showed, the BFI's stunning re-release of 'Daughters of the Dust' – a landmark in film history and the first film directed by a Black woman ever to receive theatrical release in the US. A ground-breaking feature with dreamlike aesthetics that were the main inspiration for much of Beyoncé's 'Lemonade'.
