THIS MONTH AT SHEFFIELD VOICES

YOUNG PERSON'S SELF-ADVOCACY PROJECT

At the We Speak, You Listen event in January, we asked people how we can help young adults in Sheffield get more involved and have a voice.



We are very excited to announce that Sheffield Voices have been granted some money to set up a **Young Persons Self-Advocacy project.**

We want to hear from members of Sheffield Voices about how they think this money should be spent. Some people have said it would be great to have people from Sheffield Voices be Peer-Advocates for the young people.

PARKING ON PAVEMENT UPDATE

Sheffield Voices have been speaking to the Council about the problem with people parking their cars on pavements and in front of dropped kerbs.

This has caused problems for lots of people, such as people in wheelchairs and people with mobility issues. When there is a car blocking the footpath, it forces people to have to go onto the road, which can be very unsafe.



At Sheffield Voices, we strongly believe that everybody has a right to travel safely and have equal access to pavements.

Last month, Sheffield City Council started an online survey about this is hear people's opinions. The survey has now been closed. Thank you to everyone that took part!

THE FUTURE OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES



In February and March 2023, Sheffield Voices and HealthWatch ran some events in the Learning Disability community. These events were about **what people want Mental Health services to look like** for people with Learning Disabilities. People shared all the things that keep them well. We also talked about how people felt about the closure of Firshill Rise.





Some of the opinions we heard about this topic, were:

- There needs to be more done to help keep people **out of hospital**.
- Support should be available for people in Sheffield. Lots of people said that when they are unwell, it is important that they are close to friends, family and staff who know them.
- People should be able to do things that keep them well, like **spending time** with animals and being connected to their community. Some people also suggested activities like gardening and farming.
- People want spaces to feel **safe**. They don't want to feel like they're being punished when they're unwell by being 'locked up'.

WE SPEAK, YOU LISTEN MARCH



Last month's We Speak, You Listen event was all about the **Covid Memorial project**. It also took place on the same day as **Red Nose Day**.

We had lots of activities to get us thinking about Covid and how people felt during **lockdown**.

We played drama games and learned how to mime!

Everyone was given a red nose and we took a big group picture whilst singing 'Always Look on The Bright Side of Life'.

On **Sunday 23rd April,** there will be an **'Emergency Alert**' sent to your mobile phone.

Everyone in the UK with a mobile phone will receive this alert. You will be alerted with a **siren sound and a vibration**. On the 23rd April, it will be a practice alert, to see if it works.

In the future, you will receive these alerts if there is a disaster such as **flooding, fires, or extreme weather.**

YORK SELF-ADVOCACY CONFERENCE

On **Tuesday 25th April 2023**, York People First are having a **conference** called 'What is the way forward for self-advocacy?'.

It is a conference about the **future of self-advocacy** in York, North Yorkshire and North/East Lincolnshire. They will be talking about how self-advocacy helps people to **stay independent**, **stay well and live good lives**.

They also want to speak about what self-advocacy can do for people coming out of **mental health hospitals**, and what they can do to support self-advocacy in the future. It will be run by, and for, people with Learning Disabilities and Autistic/Neurodiverse people.
