SEVEN IN TEN EMPLOYERS SCREENING JOB CANDIDATES ON SOCIAL MEDIA, STUDY FINDS

An increasing number of employers are screening job candidates on social media, it has been reported. Research from CareerBuilder found that 70% of employers are using platforms such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram to gain insight into the potential suitability of candidates, up from 60% in 2016 and 11% in 2006.



Rosemary Haefner, chief HR officer at CareerBuilder, said the findings highlight the importance of cultivating a positive online persona. "Most workers have some sort of online presence todayand more than half of employers won't hire those without one," she noted. "Jobseekers should make their professional profiles visible online and ensure any information that could negatively impact their job search is made private or removed."

LONGER, PAID WORK EXPERIENCE PLACEMENTS 'MOST BENEFICIAL'



Young people believe work experience placements are more valuable to their career if they are at least four weeks long and paid, a study has found. Prospects found that only 24% of placements last a month or longer and only 12% are remunerated, but students who undertake such placements are more likely to consider them useful to their professional development.

Jayne Rowley, chief executive of Prospects, noted that employers no longer view academic achievements in isolation - they want to see evidence of skills and an understanding of what it is like to work. "The longer the placement, the greater the benefit," she claimed. "We must encourage more students to undertake work experience of at least four weeks to give the desired boost to their career prospects."

3/4 OF FIRMS PREDICT INCREASE IN SKILLED ROLES

Three-quarters of UK firms expect the number of skilled roles to increase in the coming years, according to research from the Confederation of British Industry.



John Cope, head of education and skills at the CBI, said there is a "growing need" for higher-level education, training, and skills, as well as the importance of lifelong learning. "Better information and careers guidance for people - alongside greater numbers of flexible learning opportunities - is vital to help people choose the best route for them to higher level skills, whether that's at a university, college, or learning on the job through a degree apprenticeship," he added.

EXPERIENCE MORE IMPORTANT THAN QUALIFICATIONS, EMPLOYERS SAY



Employers are more interested in job candidates' practical experience than their qualifications, an AAT survey has indicated.

Some 49% of employees questioned said they prefer to see experience from a relevant apprenticeship or previous position, with 71% saying this is because a candidate has demonstrated their skills in a practical setting and 62% because it indicates they understand the world of work. Personality, attitude and ability to work in a team were the next-most important factors.



CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS ON APPLICATION FORMS 'COULD BREACH GDPR'

Requesting criminal record declarations during the initial stage of recruitment may not be justifiable in law, Nacro has claimed.

Following analysis of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) and the new Data Protection Act, the social justice charity said it may be difficult for employers to prove a legitimate interest in gathering this information from applicants until much later in the process.

Jacob Tas, chief executive of Nacro, claimed that with the GDPR now in force, key principles of the charity's 'Ban the Box' campaign may be enforceable. "The changes don't remove an employer's ability to take into account someone's criminal record where relevant for the job, he argued. "They simply mean they should review their processes to ensure the information is requested at a more appropriate stage of the process."

Mr Tas added that employers should not fear the changes but see them as an opportunity to improve their recruitment processes. "It is time to think differently about the untapped talent that people with convictions can bring to organisations," he said.

STUDY FINDS NO DIFFERENCE IN EMPLOYABILITY BETWEEN JOBSEEKERS WITH AND WITHOUT TATTOOS



Body art is no longer an impediment to employability, new research has indicated. A study conducted by the University of Miami Business School and the

University of Western Australia Business School found that the perception of tattoos in the workplace has changed significantly in recent years, with visible body art no longer linked to individual employment or wage discrimination.

Data gathered from 2,000 survey participants showed that tattooed jobseekers are just as likely to get a job as candidates without visible body art. Andrew Timming, associate professor of human resource management at the University of Western Australia Business School, told The Independent that perceptions toward tattoos "have changed very quickly" to the extent that there is "no difference" in employability was found between those with and without tattoos.

FSB CALLS FOR HIGHER APPRENTICE PAY AND COMPULSORY WORK EXPERIENCE

The Government should raise the Apprenticeship Minimum Wage (AMW) rate to arrest the fall in the number of new apprenticeship starts, the Federation of Small Businesses (FSB) has suggested.



Mike Cherry, national chairman of the FSB, said young people taking on apprenticeships should be paid more than the AMW of £3.70 per hour. "If we really want to create parity of esteem between academic and vocational routes into work, then paying apprentices £25 a day is not helpful," he claimed.

After 70% of small firms surveyed by the FSB said school leavers are ill-prepared for the workplace, Mr Cherry called for the return of compulsory work experience for students under the age of 16. "Any Government which prides itself on backing free enterprise should look at bringing work experience back into every school," he added.

SHEFFIELD CITY COUNCIL EMPLOYMENT AND SKILLS

SOUTH YORKS EMPLOYERS PAID £5.5M IN GRANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIPS



Between August 2015 and March 2018, the GAP Team paid almost £5.5 million in grants to 4,024 South Yorkshire small employers that recruited and trained a young apprentice aged 24 or under. Just over £2 million was paid in 1,463 GAP grants to Sheffield employers.

South Yorkshire was one of eight areas in England – and one of the original three pilot areas - where responsibility for the administration and payment of grants under the national apprenticeship grants scheme, AGE, was devolved for local management under contract to the Sheffield City Region Combined Authority,

The GAP Team at Sheffield City Council implemented a scheme that reflected local economic priorities, paying larger grants to employers who took on apprentices working in key sectors or taking higher-level courses. Grant payments ranged from £1,120 to £2,450.

Working closely with employers and training providers, the GAP Team increased take-up of apprenticeship grants for employers by 18% compared to the national scheme, reduced the time it took to pay grants to employers and, in distributing 94.4% of the region's allocated funding, was the most successful devolved grant scheme in the country.

Sheffield City Council has an arrangement with Heeley Trust to deliver free computer classes to help our Council tenants get online, to help build the confidence and know-how to allow people to access the internet.

This can help tenants do things like shopping, banking and socialising via the web, which can save money and increase convenience. Importantly, from November, individuals will only be able to apply for Universal Credit online, making it all the more important that tenants are equipped with basic computing skills.

How free computer classes can help

Free computer classes for Council tenants are held at venues across Sheffield and run by friendly, helpful advisors from the Heeley Trust. They can help users gain the skills they need at a pace that suits the individual.

As well as help to apply for Universal Credit, the classes also cover topics including how to stay safe on the internet, staying in touch with friends and family, accessing health and other services and online.

After Sales Service:


When clients have been successful and got the job and if they need smart clothing for the role, we are happy to help them out with a small capsule wardrobe to keep them going for the first few months while they settle in.
